

Missouri Youth Select Baseball Rankings - 11U

#1: Mac N Seitz Indians –

The Indians remained the premier team in the state finishing their 2011 season ranked #7 in the nation in the USSSA Power Ranking. Posted an overall record of 12 – 1 in USSSA events.

#2: Rawlings Jr. Prospects (Killian)-

The Prospects earned this one on the field with their 2nd place finish at the AAYBA World Series and an undefeated season in the tough Chesterfield Select League.

#3: Missouri Diamond Dogs-

The Diamond Dogs finished the year at 47 – 13, playing a tough schedule including many 12U events. They capped their year off with a 3rd Place finish at the Omaha Slump Buster and the AAYBA World Series.

#4: St. Louis Royales-
